

Bookshops of all sizes seem to be disappearing at an alarming rate. They are all struggling with rising costs and the impact of online sellers, such as Amazon. Please support your local bookshop and buy your books from them whilst you still can.





Whatever Next?

City Stone were very keen to promote Emergency Drill as the first book in Danny Verity, PI series. That seems like a great idea, even though Danny isn't working as a private investigator until the second book, which is entitled Dead Crude and is set in an Orkney oil terminal. A couple of the surviving characters from Emergency Drill feature heavily, as Danny investigates the disappearance of two young men connected to the terminal and the remote island of Mallach.

Dead Crude is expected to be out in the second quarter of 2024. In the meantime, I am working on the third book, provisionally entitled, Head Hunting. This one is set on the island of Borneo. It seems that Danny is mainly investigating crimes in places where I have worked. Coincidence? Maybe not.
